This 5 day training course will focus on the fundamental forensic examination techniques for adolescent and adult victims of sexual assault. This course is designed to provide the inexperienced examiner with the skills, knowledge and attitude to conduct a basic evidentiary examination. Following completion of this course it is recommended that each nurse go through a preceptorship to build upon the skill learned during this course.

2010 SEXUAL ASSAULT FORENSIC EXAMINER TRAINING COURSE

Annenberg Center for Health Science, Eisenhower Medical Center, Rancho Mirage, Ca

About the Course

This 5-day intensive training course will provide licensed healthcare professionals who are interested in practicing as Sexual Assault Forensic Examiners (SAFE/SANE) the training to enhance or establish the knowledge, skills and attitudes necessary to perform a basic sexual assault examination for adolescent/adult victims of acute sexual assault. This course meets the educational requirements of the International Association of Forensic Nurses (IAFN). Each participant will receive an in-depth orientation to physical, emotional and social reactions to sexual assault. There will be an opportunity for each participant to perform a standard evidentiary physical evaluation and examination, as well as the opportunity to collect forensic evidence with the use of anatomical models. A preceptor ship following this training course is recommended.

Course Objectives

- Describe the members of a sexual assault response team.
- Describe the 3 components of the role of the forensic examiner.
- State two myths about male sexual assault.
- List three of the most common drugs used in drug-facilitated sexual assault.
- State the role of law enforcement.
- Understand the definition of sexual assault per penal code.
- Verbalize 4 tips for health care providers to utilize when asked to testify in court.
- Demonstrate obtaining and documenting a history based on the 923 form.
- Demonstrate documentation of injury using the 923 form.
- Verbalize and demonstrate genital anatomy in practice case reviews.
- Describe the difference between the suspect and victim examination.
- State the CDC recommendation for antibiotic treatment for sexual assault.
- Demonstrate correct clothing collection and bagging for evidence kit.
- Demonstrate insertion of speculum and anoscope in model skill lab.
- List three myths of sexual assault.
